This year, on the Thursday before finals week, as on campus the tensions were rising and sleep cycles were falling apart, we decided to love our community by handing out 100 treat bags to students at the University Center. "Why only 100?" you may be asking. We made that choice partially because money is a little tight, partially because we had never done this before and we didn't know how it would go, but mostly because we've observed that students usually avoid the people in the UC manning tables. Headphones, cell phones, a constant stream of stimuli and the ability to tune out has made this a hard generation to connect with, and we weren't sure how much we'd have to do to flag down 100 students, or how long it would take.

It took one hour and 12 minutes. With very little waving and flagging, we got to see 100 smiles and tell 100 students about Wesley. But the part that will stick with me in the weeks to come was the question that almost all of them asked. They phrased it as either "What do I have to do to get it?" or "What's the catch?" It broke my heart. The idea that we just wanted to do something nice for our community, that we would give them something and expect nothing in return was unfathomable. In the days that followed I thought about how many of these students have experienced church and faith as a transactional relationship. How often is the message that the body of Christ is one in which people only love you for what you can do for them? We are trained through experience to look for the strings, the trap, the catch. Too often we find them. We are taught that nothing in this world is free.

Into that transactional world enters Jesus. When Word became flesh and dwelt among us, it was not because of what we could do for God. The gift of Christ that we wait for during Advent, celebrate during Christmas, and the Spirit that we receive at Pentecost are given freely to all of us. We do not need to earn them. We cannot repay them. The gifts of God come without bows or tinsel, but also without strings or fine print. This holiday season, it is my prayer that you experience the God's generous love, audacious hope, irresistible peace, and overwhelming joy, and that you receive them as they are given, freely.

For Spring Break 2022, we're joining once again with our friends from CMU for a combined mission trip.\*


We will be announcing our destination in January, but for now you can guess along with the Wesley students by following these clues!

3. Mountains? Rivers? We will see some sweet topography on our way


